

CHAPTER 10: RULES OF CONSTRUCTION; GENERAL PENALTY

§ 10.18 HISTORICAL AND STATUTORY REFERENCES.

(A) As histories for the code sections, the specific number and passage date of the original ordinance, and the most recent three amending ordinances, if any, are listed following the text of the code section. Example: (Ord. 60-1 210.2, passed 5-13-60; Am. Ord. 70-1210.2, passed 1-1-70; Am. Ord. 80-1 210.2, passed 1-1-80; Am. Ord. 85-1 210.2, passed 1-1-85)

(B) If a KRS cite is included in the history, this indicates that the text of the section reads word-for-word the same as the statute. Example: (KRS 83A.090) (Ord. 80-1810.1, passed 1-17-80; Am. Ord. 85-1 810.1, passed 1-1-85). If a KRS cite is set forth as a "statutory reference" following the text of the section, this indicates that the reader should refer to that statute for further information.

Example:

§ 39.01 PUBLIC RECORDS AVAILABLE.

This municipality shall make available to any person for inspection or copying all public records, unless otherwise exempted by state law.
