

Regular meeting of the Board Trustees, April 1st 1946

Four members present, Chairman Thomas, Cook, Long and Wiley

Meeting called to order by Chairman Thomas, Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Trustee, Burke having been absent for four consecutive meetings his office was declared vacant and by a unanimous vote Mr. T. E. Madison was chosen and recommended to the County Judge for appointment to fill the vacancy.

The question of street lights was again discussed and an Ordinance was passed to install three street lights, two on South Cave Street and one on the North end of College street. also all street lights to be burned all night .

The Tenth, Eleventh and Twelfth of this month was designated as Clean Up Week and Marshall Cassady was instructed to contact delinquent tax payers that wanted to work out their taxes, he obtained three laborers on this plan . Total labor cost on this project was \$72.00, -- 144 hours. \$9.80 taxes was collected from this labor.

By a unanimous vote of all members present it was ordered to insert an notice in the Park City Daily news with reference to this Clean Up week, also a notice to delinquent tax payers that a penalty of 10% would be added after April 30th.

An Ordinance was passed by all members voting AYE, to place an Occupational tax on Pin Ball machines of \$10.00 per year and Jute Box machines \$5.00 per year.

The question of selling the old jail property was discussed and this sale approved by all members present to conduct this sale on Saturday April 13th. at " P. M.

The matter of Traffic signs was again taken up and signs ordered to be put up at the Corporate limits on main street and these signs to read " Speed limit, 25 miles per hour," this law to be enforced.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned until our next regular meeting night May 6th.
