

City Commission meeting. - April 22, 1991

Mayor Gilley called the meeting to order with commissioners Lacy, McGuffey and Belcher in attendance.

1. Minutes of the previous meeting

Mayor Gilley called for additions or corrections to these minutes, with none to be heard, Comm. McGuffey floored a motion to accept than as written, seconded by Comm. Lacy. Roll call and vote - Belcher yes, Gilley yes, Lacy yes, McGuffey yes.

2. Treasurer's report

With no discussion or corrections to this report, Comm. Belcher presented a motion it be accepted as printed, seconded by Comm. McGuffey. Roll call and vote - Belcher yes, Gilley yes, Lacy yes, McGuffey yes.

3. Discussion - publication of bids for street repair and/or resurfacing

The commission held a lengthy discussion regarding the proposed new street ordinance. Most were of the opinion that if the city enacted the ordinance as written, it would cost the city too much to resurface the streets in the future. All of the commission agreed to table this decision until the next meeting and Comm. Belcher is to check to see the cost of asphalt and all pertinent costs involved. Comm. Belcher also agreed to contact Judge Griffin to see when he can get a county truck to get the alleys graded and graveled.

4. Excess community development lot

Mayor Gilley informed the commission that Johnetta Britt had been in contact with the clerk numerous times about her possibly purchasing this lot. The Mayor said at the time the lots had been auctioned, Ronnie Pearson bid it in at a total price of \$875.00 and had paid \$175.00 down on it leaving a balance of \$700.00. New he wondered the commission's feelings regarding the 'resale of it. Comm. Lacy presented a motion to offer the lot to Ms. Johnetta Britt for a price of \$700.00,

seconded by Comm. Belcher. Roll call and vote - Belcher yes, Gilley yes, Lacy yes, McGuffey yes.

5. Quarterly financial statement - Smiths Grove Cemetery

The commission reviewed this report and with no additions or corrections to be heard, Comm. McGuffey presented a motion to accept it as printed, seconded by Comm. Lacy. Roll call and vote - Belcher yes, Gilley yes, Lacy yes, McGuffey yes.

6. Other

Comm. Lacy said he had seen in the paper where Richard Lawrence's house on Lawson was to be sold at auction Thurs. 4/25 and wondered if there were any taxes due and if the city could collect them. It was decided to check with the clerk.

With no further business to be presented a motion to adjourn was heard.
