

City Commission meeting - February 27, 1984, City Hall - 7:00 p.m.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by the Mayor with all commissioners in attendance.

A motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting, since all of the commissioners had had an opportunity to read them, was made by Comm. Gilley, seconded by Comm. Garmon. Roll call and vote - Marr yes, Gilley yes, Milliken yes, Jackson yes, Garmon yes.

Mayor Milliken distributed copies of the treasurer's report for the period 1/23 thru 2/24/84, and ask the commissioners to review it for possible additions or corrections.

### 1. Second reading - Ordinance #84.1-920.1

A motion to allow the rezoning for Bud Greenup stated in the above ordinance was made by Comm. Garmon, seconded by Comm. Jackson. Roll call and vote - Garmon yes, Jackson yes, Milliken yes, Gilley yes, Marr yes.

### 2. Old business

#### a. L&N railroad crossing

Mayor Milliken read a letter he had written to L&N

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on January 28th asking the help of the railroad company regarding the problems the city is having with the crossing gates. As yet, he has not had a reply.

#### b. School bus parking problem

The Mayor reported this problem had been resolved.

### 3. Treasurer's report

After reviewing the report, a motion was presented by Comm. Garmon, seconded by Comm. Jackson, to accept the report as written.

Mayor Milliken ask the clerk if there were any available funds for the purchase of rock for streets within the city in need of repair. The clerk said there were funds in the street savings for this purpose. The Mayor ask Comm. Jackson, as street commissioner, to survey the streets most in need of some rock and report to him in the near future. The commissioners agreed it would be cheaper to contact Squire Kirby about using county trucks to do the hauling. Mayor Milliken presented a motion, \$500.00 be transferred from the street fund savings to the general fund for the purchase of rock, seconded by Comm. Marr. Roll call and vote - Marr yes, Gilley yes, Milliken yes, Jackson yes, Garmon yes.

Comm. Marr said numerous citizens were complaining about the poor service being received from cable TV. The Mayor said he had been in contact with Sarah Glenn, General Manager for Storer Communication, and she informed him they thought they had the problems solved. He noted this obviously is not so. He ask the clerk to contact Ms. Glenn, explain our problems and report her findings to him. She agreed to do so.

With no further business to be discussed, a motion to adjourn was presented.
