Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees, Tuesday, January 7, 1969.

The Board met in regular session at the American National Bank and Trust Co. with all members present.

Mr. Henry Padgett, District Engineer, and Mr. Van Meter of the Highway Department attended the meeting to discuss the Maintenance and Traffic Contract which the State is requesting the City to sign. Mr. Van Meter said he would be glad to ask any questions. It was established that this is a contract which is required by the State and most cities have already signed this. Items under question were discussed and clarified. Trustee Blackwell made a motion that we sign the contract with the State. Trustee Powell seconded the motion. There were no dissenting votes. The contract will be mailed later for signatures.

Trustee Hill thanked Mr. Padgett on behalf of the Town Board and the S O S for installing the caution light at the intersection of Highway # 101 and #68. Trustee Melton suggested that we are still in need of ramps for I-65.

3. A new interim zoning was read and discussed. Trustee Blackwell made a motion that we adopt this interim zoning ordinance which is attached to and becomes a part of these minutes. Powell seconded the motion. Trustee Hill passed. Trustee Lowe voted not. Motion carried. This ordinance is to be posted at the Bank, Powell's grocery and the McGuffey Insurance Agency.

4. Clerk presented the financial statement for 1968. The city has paid \$50 to the L & N for a parking lot and the merchants on the S/S of Main Street are to reimburse the city for this payment. Clerk was asked to write Josie Hunt, Jim Cullen and L. Carl Rasdall regarding this payment.

5. The water system was discussed. Carrie Lee Jordan has asked to be relieved of the bookkeeping duties. J. W. Blue said he would check the books to see if he wanted the job.

6. Clerk was asked to write the Attorney General regarding a car sticker for sixth class cities.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned until the next regularly scheduled meeting.
