

Special called City Commission meeting - July 2, 1990 - 6:30 p.m. -City Hall

Mayor Gilley called the meeting to order explaining that the purpose of the meeting was to attempt to reach a final decision regarding the installation of the fire hydrant on Webb Ave. Eddie Shirley from the Warren Co. Water Dist. was in attendance to answer questions the commission might have regarding same. The questions were as follows:

Comm. McGuffey - from the existing city right of way-how far into the yards would the company go. Mr. Shirley responded, 8 to 10 feet. Mr. Shirley said that in the future the two inch lines would have to be replaced as the lines are too small. Comm. Lacy wondered at that time would the city have to replace the lines or would the Water Co. do so. Mr. Shirley wasn't sure of that answer. Comm. Belcher wondered what the cost would be to go all the way to the end of Webb by the Carroll residence and then angle back to put the fire hydrant there. Mr. Shirley said it would run an additional \$200.00 to \$250.00 to do this. Mayor Gilley wondered if where the Water Company had already started to dig was the best, all around place for the line and hydrant to be. Mr. Shirley felt to extend the line down Webb would be the best. The commission all felt that this would be unsatisfactory to the residents because of having to bore their drives, as well as the chance of damaging the trees. Mr. Shirley said if it was the cost of boring the drives that was holding the commission back from making this decision, he felt sure he could get the water company to pay for this. With no more discussion to be had, Comm. McGuffey presented a motion to place the line as the company had started, behind the houses on the west side and bring the line clear down to the south end of Webb. with the hydrant being placed behind what is now a vacant house, seconded by Comm. Lacy. Roll call and vote - Belcher yes, Lacy yes, Crisp yes, McGuffey yes, Gilley yes. The commission asked Mr. Shirley when he thought they could proceed. He had talked with Richard Hurt and he doesn't have to use his kidney machine on Tues. and Thurs. So he was sure they could proceed Thurs. July 12.

With no more business to be heard, a motion to adjourn was floored.
