

City Commission meeting - June 25, 1990 - 7:00 p.m. - City Hall

Mayor Gilley called the meeting to order with all commissioners in attendance

AGENDA

1. Minutes of the previous meeting

These minutes were presented for the commission's consideration and for corrections if any were to be heard. With no additions or corrections, Comm. McGuffey presented a motion to accept them as printed, seconded by Comm. Crisp. Roll call and vote- Belcher yes, Gilley yes, McGuffey yes, Crisp yes, lacy yes.

2. Treasurer's report

The clerk informed the commission this was the last report for this fiscal year. Mayor Gilley called for corrections or additions to same, with none to be heard, Comm. Crisp presented a motion to accept the report as printed, seconded by Comm. McGuffey. Roll call and vote - Belcher yes, Gilley yes, McGuffey yes, Crisp yes, Lacy yes.

3. Second reading FY 1990~1991 budget Ordinance #90-3 220.102.

Comm. Belcher presented a motion to accept the second reading of this ordinance, seconded by Comm. McGuffey. Roll call and vote - Belcher yes, Gilley yes, McGuffey yes, Crisp yes, Lacy yes.

4. Opening of sealed bids for the excess community development lot

Mayor Gilley informed those in attendance, the city had advertised for sealed bids for this lot to be opened at this- meeting. Since none were received, the commission declared the matter closed.

5. Old business

a. uniforms for the police chief

This matter had been discussed at the May meeting, and the commissioners in attendance had decided to table a decision until all of the commission was in attendance. Mayor Gilley asked each of the commissioners an opinion on purchasing these uniforms. All were in agreement; the Kentucky State Police had wanted this to be done for a long time. Comm. Crisp presented a motion to now allow the clerk to order these uniforms, seconded by Comm. McGuffey. Roll call and vote - Belcher yes, Gilley yes, McGuffey yes, Crisp yes, Lacy yes.

b. Regal Jackson residence

Mayor Gilley said the people living next to Mr. Jackson were attempting to sell; their house and everyone who looked at it wouldn't be interested because of the eyesore at Mr. Jackson's house. The clerk told the commission the city had no ordinance which pertained to this matter. The commission directed the clerk to contact the Warren Co. Health Dept. to seek assistance in this matter. She agreed to do so.

Other

a. hedge at Donald Watt's house

Comm. McGuffey said this hedge was obstructing the view of motorists attempting to pull out onto Main St. and wondered if the city had an ordinance pertaining to this matter. The clerk agreed to check and contact Mr. Watt about this matter

b. Stop sign and culvert

Chief Denton wondered if the clerk had informed the commission about the stop sign at the corner of Sunset & Oakland Road being down, she said she had told the Mayor. He also said the culvert the corner of Sunset & Main was mashed down. Mayor Gilley said it looked like the phone company was doing some work in that area and we would wait to see if this problem was corrected by this work.

c. Lonnie Stockton - grading of alley behind his house.

Mr. Stockton reported he had talked with Magistrate Carrier and he informed him that if either Comm. Belcher or Mayor Gilley called him, he would send a grader and manpower to grade Mr. Stockton's alley. Comm. Belcher told Mr. Stockton he would need to know exactly how far the alley was to be graded and how wide, Mr. Stockton said he had only graveled to his garage and the alley is supposed to be 15 feet wide. He said there was a stump from a cherry tree in the way on down from his house that he thought would obstruct the grader from grading any further Comm. Belcher ask, if the grader could push it down would it be alright for them to go the entire length of the alley. Mr. Stockton said it was fine with him. Comm. Belcher agreed to contact magistrate Carrier when he arrived home after the meeting.

d. water line & fire hydrant installation

the clerk informed the commission this work was on hold until Kenneth Priddy, the fire chief had contacted Mr. Eddie Shirley from Warren Co. Water Dist. Regarding the placement of the hydrant on Webb Ave. Comm. McGuffey said he had talked with Mr. Chuck Glass prior to the meeting and Mr. Glass stated he would grant the Water Co. an easement to go across his property so the hydrant could be located on Webb. which would be accessible for the fire department for all, of the residences, if the Warren Co. Water District would agree to not leave a ditch in his yard. The clerk agreed to inform the water company of this decision. Chief Priddy said as long as the hydrant was located somewhere on Webb Ave. and not behind the houses where the line is being placed; it would be fine with the fire department.

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With no further business to be discussed, a motion to adjourn was heard.
