3. 2nd reading 1991 vehicle tax rate Ordinance #90-4 220.103

Comm. Belcher approached the commission on their feelings about chipping & sealing the T portion at the north end of Webb Ave. and Ridgecrest. The

commission was in complete agreement this should be done but wondered with the continuing increase in the price of oil if the price wouldn't be too high. Comm. Belcher agreed to check these prices and report on same at the Oct. meeting.
