Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees, Tuesday, April 2, 1967.

The Board met at the American ^National Bankand Trust Company with all members present. State Representative Ed Brown was present to discuss the possibilities of obtaining a full diamond at the interchange of I65. He suggested that each candidate be contacted by letter asking a direct question regarding this situation and requesting an answer. He suggested that a copy of the letter be mailed to the Commissioner of Highway, a copy to him and a copy to Senator Floyd Ellis. He thought it wise to bring to the attention of the candidates the fact that we are goowing and expanding and there will be a great need for this interchange. He emphasised that even though this is a small community we are powerful if we will just use our power. He was questioned regardin the Save our School effort and commented that if we were unable to keep our present high school, then we should work for one to be located as nearby as possible. The Board thanked Mr. Brown for coming.

2. Trustee Rasdall made a motion that a letter be written to each candidate asking them to commit themselves to build the other $\frac{1}{2}$ of the diamond for the interchange of 101 and I 65. Trustee Blackwell seconded the motion. There were no dissenting votes. Chairman Melton volunteered to contact an attorney regarding the proper wording for the letter.

3. Trustee Rasdall reported the water system work is progressing in a satisfactory manner and new water should be in the lines within two weeks. It was the opinion of the board that since water has been served to the Geneva Anderson and Alexander farms, we will have to continue to furnish this water.

4. Chairman Melton and Trustee Rasdall reported that we do have to drill a new well and they have been meeting with prospective drillers and pump men.

5. It has been suggested that a light be placed in the chapel at the cemetery to show the beautiful windows. Chairman Melton and Trustee Raddall will investigate this. Also, the blacktopping around the chapel is to be done as soon as possible.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned until the next regularly scheduled meeting.
