Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees, Tuesday, April 5, 1966.

The Board met at the American National Bank and Trust Company with all members present.

Attorney English had made an error in one of the forms which had been submitted to the Public Service Commission, so a new application had to be submitted. Trustee Rasdall reported this should be in the mail at this time and we should be cleared by the Commission by the latter part of the week. He reported that the easement rights are practically all cleared. The outstanding ones are the bank, Mr. Flora and Dale Wilson. No trouble is expected on any of these. Trustee Rasdall reported he thought the pertinent points of business should be the agreement on an operator & the insurance. There is to be a \$10 deposit fee. Mr. Thomas is to refund all his meter deposits to the property owners and we will start with a clean slate. It was agreed that information should be submitted to the public before we mail them a bill.

2. It was established that a municipality is not under the public Service Commission but a privately owned business is.

3. A general discussion was held as to a possible operator. According to the budget, the salary for an operator is \$180. There is an extra \$50 for billing and collecting but this includes printing and postage. Ralph Tabor seemed to be the most logical person. Chairman Melton asked Mr. Rasdall to verify these figures and then we will need to have another meeting.

4. Clerk Bybee gave some figures on a comprehensive general liability policy and a workmen's compensation policy. Chairman Melton asked that this be submitted in writing.

5. Cemetery Clerk, Carrie Lee Jordan, was present and gave a good report. The Cemetery is in good financial condition.

6. Judge Blue was present and his salary was discussed. It was agreed to pay him \$12 a month retroactive to January 1. Trustee Powell made a motion that we pay him \$12 a month. Trustee Lowe seconded the motion. There were no dissenting votes

7. The Board agreed to set the first week in May as the date for the annual Spring Clean Up. Clerk was asked to notify the paper. Clerk was asked to see about some stop signs for various intersections.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
