Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees, Wednesday, August 3, 1960.
The Board met at 7:30 P.M. in the American National Bank an drust Company with all members present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.
2. Police report - Mr. Cassady reported that he had the lot belonging to Mrs. Edwin Hampton cleaned off.
3. Judge had no report.
B. Mrl Cassady reported that the load of black top for patching the streets probably could be secured this week. The truck has been broken down and caused this delay.
5. Clerk reported that Paul Barrick is not interested in moving the fire sirens and she was asked to contact Claude Turner to do this work.
6. Clerk reported that a notice needs to be sent to the Assistant Attorney General, Walter Herdman, concerning the special vote for the 25申 tax raise to be used for fire equipment. the following wording was agreed on - Do you favor a special $25 \phi$ tax for fire truck, yes or no.
7. Broken street signs were not di scussed.
8. Clerk has asked August Winkenhofer to draw up the final ordinanace for an nexation but this has not been received.
9. Tentative dates for a meeting concerning the new tax and the pruchase of fire fighting equipment are October 27 with November 3 as second choice.
10. Clerk reported that fine gravel and a roller when the street is bleeding most would be the most helpful for College Street. This shoul d be better than sand. Chairman Smith volunteered to contact Mclellan Stone Company concerming thi s situation.
11. Chairman Smith reported that he had been informed that the new street light s had been ordered and would be installed as so on as possible.
12. Clerk reported that the grown-up lots had been cut.
13. Trustee Powell inquired as to whether or not private business men would be allowed to black-top the $L \& N$ parking lot. It is the opinion of the Board that they could do so at their own expense.
14. Chairman Smith asked each member to check with the Industrial Board to see what progress they are making.
15. Trustee Powell inquired as to whether or not the Board would be interested in building a street from the Witherspoon property to the Webb Tabor property. He was advised to contact the property owners and if they are in agreement, the Board will go along.

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16. Mr. Cassady presented the problem of parking conditions around the White House Cafe and the hours the restaurant is staying open. He reported that at I PM last Saturday night there were 36 vehicles parked in the I\& $\mathbb{N}$ lot. It was reported that this is a starting point for drag races. A lengthy discussion was held on this increasing menance of youthful drivers using the streets of our town for drag races. All members of the Board were much interested in this problem. Chairman Smith entertained a motion that no parking signs from 12 midnight to $6 \mathrm{~A} . \mathrm{M}$. be placed in the parking lots. This wo ld give Mr. Cassady a valid reason for asking the drivers to leave. Trustee Madison made a motion that the no parking signs reading from 12 midnight to 6 Am . be placed in both lots. Trustee Jordan seconded the motion. There were no dissenting votes. Chairman Smiths is to have Miles Smith print some temporary signs as they are expected to be removed nightly for a period. Chairman Smith suggested that Mr. Cassady contact Mr. Bledsoe $\delta f$ the White House Cafe and present him wi th a copy of the recommendation made by the Board last January requesting that al 1 business houses cooperate with the Board by closing at 12 midnight. Clerk gave Mr. Cassady a copy of this letter. If Mr. Bledsoe does not comply with this request then it was suggested that an Ordinanace be adopted ordering all business places within the city limits of Smiths Grove to close at 12 Midnight.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned until the next regularly scheduled meeting the first Wednesday in September, 1960.
