Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees, Tuesday, February 4, 1969.

The Board met in regular session at the American National Bank and Trust Company with all members and one visitor present.

1. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

2. Trustee Melton said a drainage problem exists at the new factory and this is to be remedied starting February 5. The factory is tentatively set to open on February 15.

3. Mr. Pierce, the visitor, asked if the factory is to be sprinklered. If it is, there is no booster line for the truck. Mr. Pierce and Mr. Blackwell will investigate this situation.

4. The heating system at the fire station is not satisfactory and Mr. Blackwell is to contact Motley and Barrow regarding this situation.

5. Mr. Pierce said the fire department is now going fine and they would like to build a new fire station as they do not have room for their school or their meetings. They are willing to sponsor circuses and have fish frys and such to raise money. Chairman Melton said if they could raise the money, the town would have no objection to their building a new fire station.

6. Mr. Pierce is to have a key to the rest room at the jail in order to use the bathroom during fire department meetings.

7. Trustee Blackwell made a motion that the town pay Harold McGuffey \$100 for the landscaping of the office grounds because Mr. McGuffey gave his land for the sidewalk to the post office. Trustee Powell seconded the motion. There were no dissenting votes.

8. Trustee Powell reported he had given permission to Smith Mitchell to work up the city lot which adjoins his property, plant grass and then fence it off so his customers would not use it.

9. Trustee Hill reported that Jim Cullen had received a letter from the Attorney General to the effect that it is required to finger print everyone who is jailed. This being the case, Jim Cullen needs a fingerprinting machine. Trustee Powell made a motion that we buy this at a cost of \$35. Trustee Lowe seconded the motion. There were no dissenting votes.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned until the next regularly scheduled meeting.
