

Special called City Commission meeting - July 21, 1986 -9:00 a.m. City Hall

Mayor Gilley called the meeting to order with Commissioners, Smith, Barrow Bryce in attendance.

Mayor Gilley stated the purpose of the meeting was to decide what was the best approach financially for the city regarding the library. He said the Library Board would like for the city to commit to paying all of the utilities and the insurance. None were in favor of making a commitment to paying the utilities or all of the insurance. They felt it would be more beneficial for the city to commit to a set amount annually plus the insurance on the building and not the contents since the contents were not city owned. After a lengthy in which all of the commission agreed the library was a definite asset to the city. Comm. Bryce presented a motion the city fund \$1,200.00 to the library paid in quarterly payments, plus cover the insurance on the building, excluding the contents, seconded by Comm. Smith. Roll call and vote - Smith yes, Bryce yes, Barrow yes, Gilley yes.

The Library Board had also ask the city to lease the building to them for a nominal fee. Comm. Bryce presented a motion the city least lease the building to them for a fee of \$1.00 per year, seconded by Comm. Smith. Roll call and vote - Smith yes, Bryce yes, Barrow yes, Gilley yes.

Mayor Gilley said Tom Jones, representing the Chamber of Commerce had approached him about a public park and swimming pool for the city. The clerk and Mr. Jones had met with a member of the BRADD offices about the possibility of receiving a grant towards this effort. Lisa Evans from BRADD said the possibility of the city receiving enough grant money to do this was very favorable. The commission agreed this would be a good thing for the city and Comm. Barrow presented a motion, the clerk apply for this grant, seconded by Comm. Bryce. Roll call and vote - Smith yes, Bryce yes, Barrow yes, Gilley yes.

With no further business to be discussed the meeting was adjourned.
