Lawyer Charles English came with the ordinances adopting the proposed rates and the ordinance adlopting the provisions for the bond sale. In the meantime Mr. Melton will contact Jim Cullen who has been mentioned as a possible policeman and night watchman. Trustee Rasdall stated that as a business man he felt all business places would be willing to pay for protection. Mr. McGuffey had contacted Captain Millard Sharp of the State Police and he advised if he had a man available he would send him here if he received a call. Magistrate Richard Kirby stated he would help in any way possible. It had been suggested that he might be of aid in securing stop signs and speed limit signs. Both are badly needed.

Chairman Melton stated the water system is nearing completion and the factory is supposed to start training in July.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned until the next regularly scheduled meeting.
