Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees, Tuesday, March 5, 1968.

The Board met at the American National Bank and Trust Company with all members present. There was one visitor, Jack Walker.

Chairman Melton reported that we need to sell the bonds for the factory. These are $5\frac{1}{2}\%$ Tax Free bonds. We will need to sell a minimum of \$75,000 before the contract will be signed. Chairman Melton said he had talked to Congressman Natcher recently and he is positive there is no pending legislation which would interfere with the sale of these tax free bonds. These bonds are negotiable bonds. He said he felt perfectly assured that if you wanted to cash your bonds, you can take them to any bank.

- 2. Mrs. Jordan reported that she has had some reports of sand. Trustee Powell said this would occur until all the old sand was washed from the existing lines.
- 3. It was decided to use discretion in adjusting water bills. Some meters are dead and some have been misread.
- 4. A discussion was held as to the number of people answering farm alarms. Trustee Blackwell was asked to contact Chief Herald regarding some colored people on the fire department.
- 5. Trustee Hill reported Jim Cullen would like to be appointed Deputy Constable in case he is called out of the city limits. Chairman Melton is to disucss this with Judge Griffin and also the fact that the county police department is not cooperating with us when they are called.
- 6. It was noted that some merchant or merchants is not burning the refuse which is placed in the incinerator. Trustee Melton is to investigate this and if necessary have it removed.
- 7. Trustee Powell reported we **sho**uld have spring clean-up earlier in order to obtain the services of a country dump truck. Trustee Lowe is to check with Thomas Webb and D. F. Jones regarding a dumping site.
- 8. Trustee Lowe again asked about a street light for Mrs. P. H. Buter. Chairman Melton is to talk to the Warren RECC regarding the cost of installation.
- 9. Nothing new was done on the zoming amendment.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned until the next regularly scheduled meeting.
