

Special called City Commission meeting - May 17, 1984 -
City Hall - 9:00 a.m.

Mayor pro tem James Jackson called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

1. Mayor W. Currie Milliken's resignation

Mayor pro tern Jackson read the resignation tendered by Mayor Milliken, dated May 14, 1984, for the commission's consideration. (copy attached). After a brief discussion, Comm. Gilley presented a motion the resignation be accepted, seconded by Comm. Garman. Roll call and vote - Garman yes, Jackson yes, Gilley yes, Marr yes, Mayor pro tem Jackson then read a letter from the commission to Mayor Milliken accepting his resignation. (copy attached)

2. Commission's appointment of a new Mayor

Mayor pro tern Jackson said he had talked at length with former Mayor Clarence Wolffe regarding the position of Mayor. Mr. Wolffe stated, he was not interested in being either Mayor or commissioner. Comm. Jackson said he had given considerable thought to the possibility of taking the position if Mr. Wolffe refused. After giving the other commissioners ample time to present their suggestions for a candidate, and none were presented, Mayor pro tem Jackson accepted the office. Squire Richard Kirby administered the oath of Office to Mayor James F. Jackson at 9:35 a.m.

3. Replacement of a commissioner

Comm. Garman suggested contacting Gene Woods or former Comm. Cliff Pearson. Comm. Gilley suggested James Hadley. All Commissioners agreed to contact these people to see if they are interested in the position, and if so, possibly they could be sworn in at the May 29th meeting.

With no further business to be presented, a motion was presented by Comm. Garman to adjourn.
