Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees, Tuesday, November 2, 1954.

The Board met as usual at the Deposit Bank with all members being present. After being called to order the following business was transacted:

1. Judge L. E. White, Sr. was present and presented a bill for \$12.98 for replacing broken windshield in his automobile which was sustained when his son Earl stopped quickly and pitched his little girl into to avoid hitting wire which blocked 3rd Street at College when it was under construction. Judge asks that City pay the bill since there was no light to warn of the wire. He states that had there been a light there it probably would not have happened. After considering the matter the Board decided to wait until they could check the law on it. Mrs. Stone was asked to talk to County Attorney Marshal Funk and see what the law is on a matter of that kind. If the law states that there should be a light she will notify the clerk to send Judge a check for same.

2. The clerk was directed to notify Marshall Parrish about the middle of the month that his services as caretaker at the Cemetery would cease from December 1, 1954 to March 1, 1955. Marshall is to continue as gravedigger. The clerk was also directed to find out from Marshall if he desires to continue as caretaker in 1955.

3. Upon a motion of Mrs. Crump and seconded by Mr. Denton the clerk was directed to issue check to Asphalt Products Company, Inc., Nashville, Tennessee, for \$2,832.48 for 20,232 gallons of AE-3 road oil used in recent street program and a check to the City of Bowling Green for \$675.00 for 4,500 gallons of road oil used for priming purposes.


4. The clerk was directed to write a letter of thanks to Mr. Clarence Dewese, Street Foreman, City of Bowling Green, for his help in our recent street work.

5. The clerk reported that the total spent on the recent street work was \$6,887.07 of which contributions totaled approximately \$2,800, the balance coming from the tax fund.

6. Chairman Melton is to talk to Squire Anderson about some sort of a gift to Mr. Leslie Edwards in appreciation of the work which he did for us in our recent street work.

7. The clerk was directed to write Western Kentucky Gas Company in regards to gas service to some of the colored people who are not now serviced by them.

There being no further business to come before the Board it was adjourned until the next regularly scheduled meeting Tuesday, December 7, 1954.
