Special called meeting - October 30, 1985 - 9:30 a.m., City Hall

Mayor Jackson called the meeting to order, and explained the purpose of the meeting was to hear the audit report for FY 1984-1985, presented by Cook & Co... He introduced Cheryl Hayes from the firm and turned the meeting over to her. Mrs. Haves presented each of the commissioners with a copy of the audit for their consideration. She ask for any questions or comments regarding same. The commission had none and Mrs. Hayes ask for the opportunity to explain the internal control letter the company had attached to the audit. She said the reason for wanting the clerk, to handle the payroll for the cemetery was mainly so all of the tax records would be kept in one place as well as by one person. She also said she thought the cemetery books should be totaled and balanced monthly and this would be a tremendous help when the audit was done again. She felt that perhaps it would be a good idea for the city and cemetery funds to be pooled and used for both the city and the cemetery. Comm. Garman took the floor and said he definitely wasn't in favor of this as the perpetual funds were to be used strictly for the cemetery and he wasn't in favor of any of them being used for city upkeep. All of the commission was in agreement. With no further questions or comments to be heard, Comm. Garman presented the motion to accept the audit as presented, seconded by Comm. Gilley. Roll call and vote - Gilley yes, Garman yes, Marr yes, Jackson yes.

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Mayor Jackson presented Ordinance #85-1 310.4, merger of the city and rural fire departments, for the first reading. After the Comm. had read the ordinance, it was accepted for a second reading, Oct. 31, 1985.

With no further business to be discussed, a motion to adjourn was heard.
