Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees, Wednesday, October 6, 1965

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

2. Chairman Bevarly reported that Charles English and the water engineers would start the preliminary survey on the sewage system. There will be no charges on the preliminary work providing they get the job if the grant is approved.

3. Chairman Bevarly said it had been suggested that the town pay for a dinner for the law enforcement officers who will help us on Halloween. Mrs. Benton Anderson is willing to prepare the meal. Trustee Jordan made a motion that we pay up to \$25 to Geneva Anderson for entertainment of the officers who help us with the Halloween activity and also for Cliff Pearson to check the streets and general appearance of the town on Sunday morning, October 31 and Monday morning November 1 and remove any debris. Trustee Powell seconded the motion. There were no dissenting votes.

4. Chairman Bevarly reported that some new lights and poles had to be installed on the school grounds for the horse show and the football games. It had been suggested that the PTA would pay $\frac{1}{4}$ of this cost, school $\frac{1}{4}$, Lions Club $\frac{1}{4}$ and the City $\frac{1}{4}$. Trustee Ferguson made a motion that the City pay $\frac{1}{4}$ of this particulary bill. Ttustee Jordan seconded the motion. There were no dissenting votes. Clerk is to contact Bill Hardy regarding the amount.

5. Chairman Bevarly stated the water system seems to be at a stand still but the engineers are finishing the final det of plans. Then they will be let out on bids. If the bids are more than the Government will allow then we will have to change our plans. The American National Bank is to take care of the financing at 4%.

6. The Memorial Chapel plans are ready to let out on bids. There will be two alternate bids. Thomas Webb, Jimmie Jackson and Buddy Lucas will be given an opportunity to submit bids.

7. The school for training volunteer firemen is to be held the week of October 11. Clerk is to call the newspaper for publicity.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned until the next regularly scheduled meeting.
